Dear Valued Customer,

As previously announced, UPS Air Cargo implemented a Fuel Price Index (FPI) methodology based on the weekly average price per gallon of Kerosene Type Jet Fuel in the U.S. Gulf Coast spot market. Fuel surcharges increase or decrease whenever the FPI passes certain thresholds for two consecutive weeks. Increasing jet fuel prices over the past two weeks have caused UPS Air Cargo to increase fuel surcharge (FSC).

In keeping with our tradition of providing our customers with an advance notification of FSC adjustments, please be advised that effective 25 April 2011 UPS Air Cargo will increase FSC.

The fuel surcharge in effect on 25 April 2011 for U.S. origin freight (excluding MIA, FLL, and SJU origins) will be as follows:

<b>United States</b> (except MIA, FLL, and SJU)	All UPS Air Cargo service areas (except where indicated below)	1.05 per KG
	United States and Puerto Rico	0.43 per LB
	Caribbean, Central and South America (except where indicated below)	1.26 per KG

The surcharge is applicable to the chargeable weight of each master air waybill, subject to a 100 KGS minimum, and will remain in effect until further notice.

We will continue to monitor jet fuel prices closely and make timely adjustments as necessary.
