

## US: Federal and State Coronavirus Responses

Last Updated: March 26<sup>th</sup>, 2020

### Critical Developments

- **State Responses:** In all 50 states, UPS and The UPS Store are exempt from any and all local, county, or virus-related restrictions and are free to keep operating. PA secured confirmation from all 50 states directly from the Governors' office.
- Many states and large cities have now issued "shelter-in-place" or "stay at home" orders, telling residents not to leave their homes.
